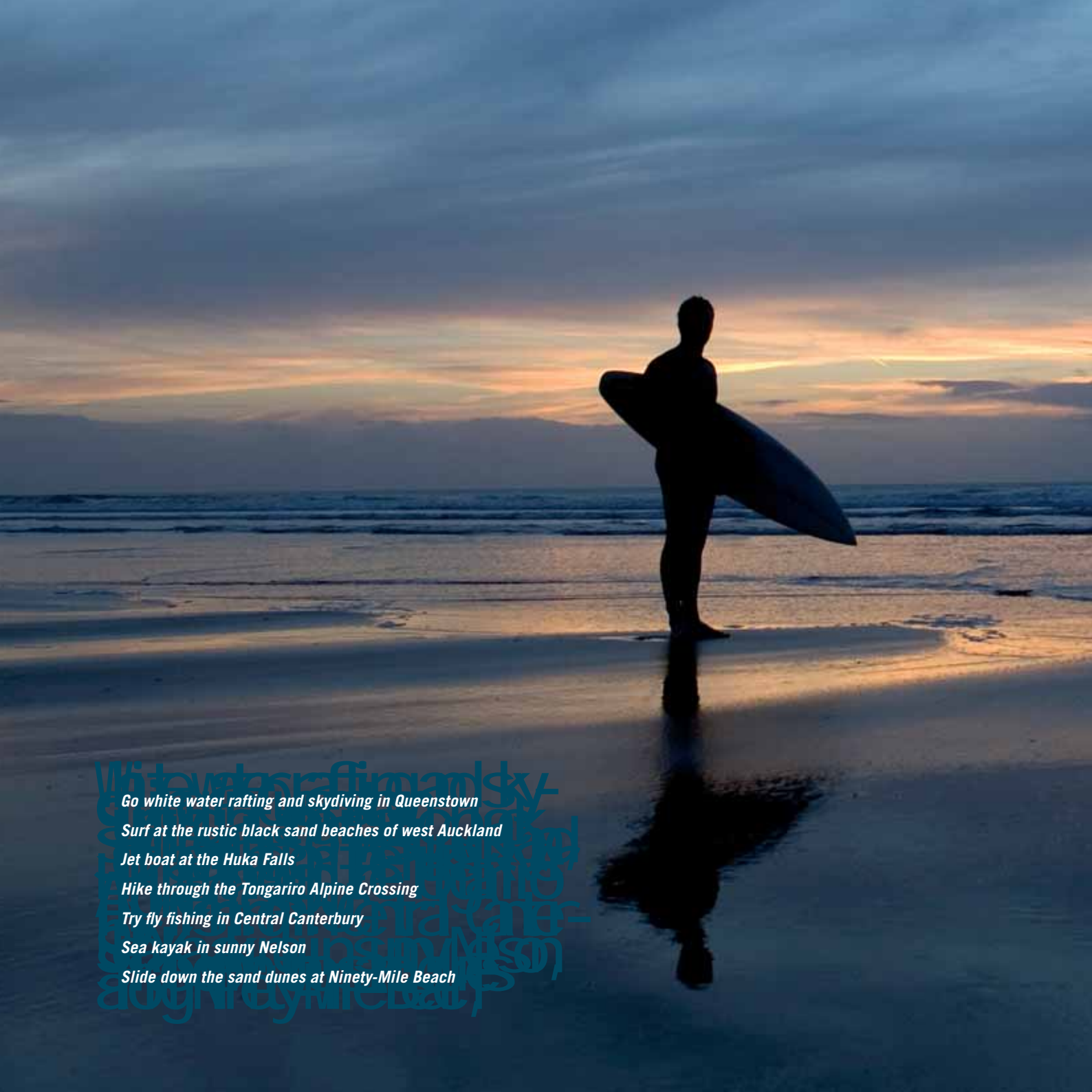

Study Abroad

Laidlaw College offers a study abroad program to students from international colleges and universities. A limited number of students are accepted each year either for a semester or two semester program. (A study abroad student must be registered in a degree granting institution.) The Laidlaw study abroad program is a part of the student's overall academic experience. While at Laidlaw, they remain a part of their primary institution's program. They are subject to the usual NZ regulations applying to International Students, including student visa requirements.

Why New Zealand?

If you're looking for adventure New Zealand is for you. This small country of 4 million people has everything you could imagine. Whether you're into climbing snow covered alpine mountains, hiking across sprawling plains, abseiling into caves carved deep in the earth, you'll find it here.

Code of Practice for International Students
